Investment Objectives

- Long-term total return > Russell 3000 Value index plus 200 to 400 bps
- Target yield \geq 150% of the Russell 3000 Value
- Long-term volatility < Russell 3000 Value

Strategy Summary

River Road's Dividend All-Cap Value ex-MLP (DAV ex-MLP) Strategy utilizes a fundamentally driven research process to identify attractive purchase candidates from an all cap universe of equity securities with attractive dividend yields. The Strategy seeks to invest in well-managed, financially strong companies with high and growing dividends, targeting companies that are also trading at meaningful discounts to our assessed valuations. Typical investment criteria include:

- Minimum market cap of \$700 MM at the time of initial purchase
- Indicated dividend yield > 0%; prefer > 2%

The stock selection process is complemented by a risk averse approach that employs balanced diversification and a structured sell discipline.

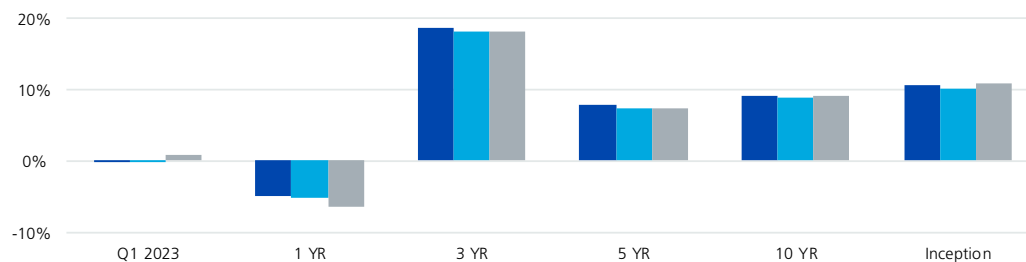

Market Highlights

- The Fed's relentless tightening campaign claimed its first significant casualties in Q1.
- Despite the Fed's best efforts, all major asset classes advanced in Q1; growth stocks outperformed value by a wide margin.
- Driven by sharp underperformance amid the January rally, dividend payers lagged non-payers in Q1.

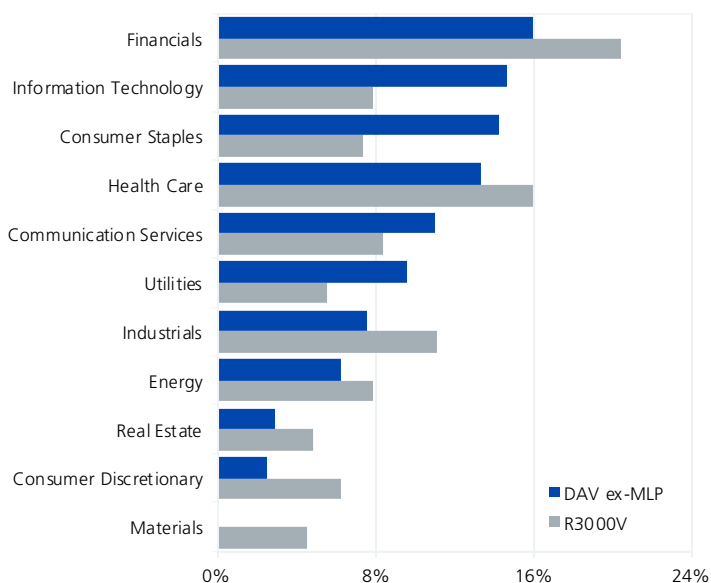
Portfolio Highlights

- The Dividend All-Cap Value ex-MLP (DAV ex-MLP) Composite underperformed in Q1, returning **-0.12%** (**-0.20%** net) versus **+0.91%** for the Russell 3000 Value benchmark, **as risk and growth focused factors led the market and dividend-related factors were among the worst performers.**
- At the end of Q1, the dividend yield of the Portfolio was **3.38%**, which is **148% of the 2.28% yield of the Russell 3000 Value** and **more than double the 1.66% yield of the S&P 500.**
- The sectors with the highest contribution to relative return (total effect) in Q1 were **Industrials (+52 bps)** and **Information Technology (+34 bps).**
- The holdings with the highest contribution to active return were **Oracle Corp. (ORCL: +14%, +58 bps)** and **Watsco Inc. (WSO: +29%, +46 bps).**
- The sectors with the lowest contribution to relative return (total effect) in Q1 were **Communication Services (-68 bps)** and **Utilities (-66 bps).**
- The holdings with the lowest contribution to active return were **AES Corp. (AES: -16%, -80 bps)** and **Pfizer Inc. (PFE: -20%, -57 bps).**

Outlook

- The events of Q1 increased the likelihood **there is a significant recession in the U.S. in 2023.** We are not only looking to balance the risk in the Portfolio but preparing to take advantage of the opportunity a correction would provide.
- Our concerns about the economy provide an attractive relative environment for the Portfolio,** and we have been extremely pleased with the relative strength of the Portfolio since the Fed kicked the hornets' nest in 2021.

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The Dividend All-Cap Value ex-MLP Composite contains fully discretionary equity income accounts that seek long-term capital appreciation and high current income by investing primarily in a diversified, all-cap basket of income producing equity securities that trade at a discount to our valuation as determined using RRAM's proprietary Absolute Value® approach. The composite is primarily invested in dividend paying common stocks. The composite may also be invested in a broad range of foreign stocks, convertible preferred stocks, Real Estate Investment Trusts ("REITs"), investment companies, LLCs, and royalty income trusts. The composite excludes any accounts invested in the Dividend All Cap Value Strategy that allows Master Limited Partnership (MLP) investments. Some accounts in the composite restrict all Publicly Traded Partnerships (i.e. both MLPs and LLCs), but the composite does include accounts that allow(ed) LLCs. RRAM employs a value-driven, bottom-up approach. The official benchmark for the Composite is the Russell 3000 Value. All other indices are shown for additional information only. Composite performance may differ materially from the indices as the Composite only invests in a subset of the securities contained in the indices and also invests in securities not contained in the indices. The U.S. dollar is the currency used to express performance and includes the reinvestment of income.
